This list contains a mix of necessary and optional items that will help you be safer, more successful and comfortable. Before you head afield, though, make sure you check the regulations of the state you will be hunting in because there may be restrictions on decoys, ammunition or gadgets you want to use.

- Bowhunting accessories (finger tab, release, arrows, broadheads, quiver)
- Turkey calls
- Locator calls
- Binocular
- Turkey decoys (where legal)
- Camo blind (where legal)
- Insect repellent
- Call accessories (chalk, sandpaper)
- Map and compass
- Flashlight
- Ratchet cutters
- Knife
- Water bottle
- First aid kit
- Seat or cushioned stool
- Rain suit
- Extra gloves and face mask
